BACKGROUND

The Board of Education, in its efforts to provide meaningful learning opportunities that reflect that Board's vision, mission and commitments for student learning, recognizes that it needs to maintain viable schools, classrooms and programs. Consequently, the Board will, from time to time, need to consider grade discontinuance or school closure based on the learning needs of students and based on utilizing resources effectively and efficiently.

If the Board wishes to consider the possible closure or the discontinuance of grades at a school, a school review must be completed. At the September 21, 2021 meeting of the Board, a motion was passed to review the viability of Kindergarten to Grade 8 at Gronlid Central School.

CURRENT STATUS

At any time during the school review process the SCC can consent to school closure. Consent by the SCC means that the school review process is halted and the board moves directly to development of a transition plan and closure. On September 22, 2021, the Gronlid Central School Community Council met and passed a motion providing consent to close Gronlid Central School following the 2021-2022 school year.

As of September 21, 2021 the Board of Education has notified the School Community Council of its intention to review the viability of Grades kindergarten to Grade 8 at Gronlid Central School.

Discussion

Prior to summer (May 19, 2021) the SCC released the following letter to parents:

As we enter into the summer months, the Gronlid School Community Council (SCC) feels the need to communicate with you on a very important issue. The SCC has received notification that the N.E.S.D. Board of Education and Director of Education have made the decision that Gronlid Central School meets the criteria to go under review for closure. As an SCC we have went through the guidelines outlined in *The Education Regulations*, and determined what has flagged Gronlid Central School into review. Unfortunately, Gronlid school meets <u>all</u> criteria for closure including;

- Below minimum enrollment numbers. Gronlid has 19 students enrolled from K-8. Criteria set out by The Education Regulations, for a K-8 school is 51 students.
- The physical condition of the school.
- Operational cost per student.
- Number of grades combined in each classroom.

The SCC believes it is their responsibility to do what is in the best interest of our children and families. We understand the impact school closure has and the process it takes to transition our children into an alternative school. Since Gronlid School meets <u>ALL</u> criteria outlined above, the SCC concludes closure is inevitable. In September 2021 if the NESD Board of Education

makes a motion to begin the review process, the SCC has made the decision that we will not proceed. Instead the SCC will agree to school closure so that we can ensure families have a much longer timeline to communicate and decide their options including bussing, school opportunities and transition plans for the 2022-2023 school year. We feel it's best to not focus all our time next school year on the review process and instead give our full attention to meeting with student' families and community members to make the best arrangements for everyone involved.

This was a very difficult decision for the Gronlid School Community Council! We are a group of parents, teachers, staff and community members that have dedicated countless volunteer hours to make Gronlid School the most unique, versatile and adaptive school within the division. We are very proud of what the school has to offer and are deeply saddened by the divisions news.
